


# 22-C Jeep Wagoneer Mud Flap Set, Front Mounting Diagram & Instructions Kit# GCR64F




## **INSTALLATION** (For ease of installation it is suggested that the wheel be removed)

- 1. Before you install your Mud Flap Set, see the diagram and parts list for all necessary parts. Start on the driver's side.
- 2. Remove factory screw from factory hole #5.
- 3. Loosely secure mudflap hole #2 to factory hole #5 using a sheet metal screw (c) and flat washer (e)



- 4. Hold rubber aligned with fender and mark the location of spring nut (g) through mud flap hole #1 and spring nut (h) through mud flap hole #4
- 5. Install spring nut (g) over durastrip (j) and spring nut (h) over mark made through mudflap hole #4.
- 6. Gently pull rubber away and install one piece of protective tape (j) over mark made through mud flap hole #1
- 7. Loosely secure mud flap hole #1 to spring nut (g) using a capscrew (b) and flat washer (d)
- 8. Loosely secure mud flap hole #4 to spring nut (h) using a capscrew (b) and flat washer (f)
- 9. Square the flap using a square or other leveling tool.
- 10. Tighten all fasteners.
- 11. Install mud flap hole #3 to factory plastic liner using a tek screw (a) and flat washer (f)
- 12. Repeat procedure for passenger side.





### **INSTALLATION** (For ease of installation it is suggested that the wheel be removed)

- 2. Before you install your Mud Flap Set, see the diagram and parts list for all necessary parts. Start on the driver's side.
- 2. Remove 3 factory screws from fender.
- 3. Loosely secure mudflap hole #3 through two spacer washers (c) to factory hole #7 using a sheet metal screw (b) and flat washer (e).



- 4. Loosely secure mud flap hole #2 through two spacer washers (c) to factory hole #6 using a sheet metal screw (b) and a flat washer (e).
- 5. Loosely secure mud flap hole #1 through one spacer washer (c) to factory hole #5 using a sheet metal screw (b) and a flat washer (e).
- 6. Hold mudflap against the liner and drill a 1/4" hole through mudflap hole #4 into factory plastic liner.
- 7. Loosely install mud flap hole #4 to hole made in factory liner using a capscrew (a) flat washer (d), and secure using a flat washer (d), lock washer (f), and hex nut (g)
- 8. Square the flap using a square or other leveling tool.
- 9. Tighten all fasteners.
- 10. Repeat procedure for passenger side.
